

Mentoring and Professional in Training (MAP-IT) 1.0 is an interprofessional longitudinal 10-month professional development program focused on using appreciative inquiry to guide professionalism and humanism as core values. As of 2024, 10 cohorts (over 1000 participants) have completed the program.



Building off the success of Clinical MAP-IT, a new MAP-IT program, 1.5, was developed in the Fall of 2023, which focuses on *character*, *caring and practical wisdom* to support human flourishing.
