New Initiative: Zoom Chats with Alumni






Student News:

 Sarah Abramowitz, BA, a medical student here at ZSOM and a Sarnoff Cardiovascular Research fellow, published her research focusing on the inconsistences of polygenic risk scores (PRSs) in the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) on November 16, 2024. She presented her findings at the American Heart Association's Scientific Sessions in Chicago, where she was the only student finalist in the Genomic and Precision Medicine Early Career Investigator Competition.
