#### Identity Theft: Protect Yourself

Don't be a statistic!

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) indicates that millions of people have their identification stolen each year. Don't be part of those statistics! Be proactive and protect yourself.

Be alert for the following signs of identity theft:

- $\cdot$  Accounts you did not open
- $\cdot$  Inaccurate information on your credit reports
- · Failure to receive bills
- $\cdot$  Receipt of credit cards that you did not apply to receive

• Denied credit or being contacted by debt collectors for no apparent reason

## FAQ's

#### When will Hofstra receive my 2025-26 FAFSA?

The 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form is now available and Hofstra University is currently working on uploading all FAFSAs to our system. It could take up to **5 business days** for our office to receive your FAFSA. You may log in to the <u>Hofstra portal</u> and access *Financial Aid Services* to confirm that your FAFSA was received. ## I didn't accept my entire loan offer and I need to borrow additional funds, what should I do?

You have until one week prior the end of the semester to submit a request to increase your loan. Requests can be submitted by emailing a <u>Loan Adjustment</u> <u>Request form</u> to <u>medicine.finaid@hofstra.edu</u> from your Pride email.

#### Can I cancel all or a portion of my federal loans?

You have a right to cancel all or a portion of a federal loan disbursement within **120 days** of the date your school disbursed your loan money. If you choose to cancel, the money you received will have to be returned, but no interest or fees will be charged.

To request a loan cancellation or return, submit a <u>Loan Adjustment Request</u> form to <u>medicine.finaid@hofstra.edu</u>.

### Outside Scholarship & Loan Repayment Opportunities

The Wellsford and Mildred Clark Scholarship was created to provide scholarships for **third-year** medical school students entering their fourth year of medical school.
